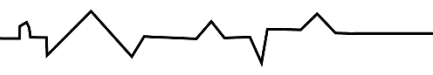

Alameda County EveryOne Counts! Street Count – Volunteer Role Description

Volunteers are an integral part of the Point-in-Time Count effort in Alameda County, supporting a robust and accurate collection of data on our neighbors experiencing homelessness. Volunteers will be matched with a Guide from the community who has current or recent lived experience of homelessness. Guides will assist the team in canvassing their assigned count area, using their direct knowledge and lived experience to help collect the most accurate data possible. Together, Volunteers and Guides will visually inspect their assigned census tracts and record the findings in order to complete the tally.

Volunteer Criteria

- At least 18 years of age
- Commit to a total of 5-6 volunteer hours, including 1 hour of training prior to the day of the count and 4-5 hours on count day
- Attend a 1-hour training session online or in-person
- Able to collaborate with a team comprised of 1-2 other Volunteers and 1 Guide in completing the street count of the entire assigned census tracts
- Able to walk as needed in assigned census tracts
- *Note:* Volunteers with cars will be asked to help transport their team members to and from their field assignment on the day of the count. However, a car is not required to volunteer.
