1. Welcome and Introductions

2. Update on COVID-19 Homeless Response

- Since the committee last met, a new hotel has opened in the City of Livermore to operate as interim housing for persons experiencing homelessness. All hotels are coming to full capacity and providers have been working with clients to get into housing. This includes getting clients document ready and connected to services. Through the state Project Homekey funding, two buildings have been acquired in Alameda County to convert to permanent housing.

3. Homeless Point-in-Time Count Update

- HUD has not provided updated guidance on how to proceed with biennial Point-in-Time Counts. Since the enumeration typically takes place in January, EveryOne Home is proceeding with planning efforts but anticipate there will be changes to the methodology due to COVID-19. Jessie will be in touch with participating organizations by the end of September.

4. CoC NOFA Scoring in Local Renewal Application

- The committee reviewed [several of the objective criteria](#) from the FY19 Local Renewal Applications for Continuum of Care funding. In reviewing the criteria, the committee also reviewed the scoring, point values, and results from last year. They also were able to compare how our objective criteria compared to other communities. Given that there has been no announcement yet from HUD on this year’s local process, the committee

will continue this conversation next month and determine if there are opportunities to refine the scoring in the next NOFA round.
