Shelter Accessibility Discussion Notes

Questions about Access to Shelters for those with Disabilities?

- How accessible are which shelters?
 - We know some have elevators, some have ramps, etc. what is the landscape?
 - What data do we have? Do we know what is or isn't working?
 - o Who monitors the shelters' accessibility capacity?
 - SSA standards apply to all County funded shelters
 - How do we ensure consistency of standards across the County no matter the funding source?
 - Could the Standards Compliance and Funding (SCF) Committee take a look? How do the existing CoC Standards talk about this?
- What funding is there to support shelters to help meet standards?
- What resources/standards exist now?
 - ADA Shelter Checklist: https://archive.ada.gov/pcatoolkit/chap7shelterchk.htm
 - SSA Shelter Standards cover any County-funded shelter, higher bar (more detailed standard) than simply ADA
 - CoC Written Standards also reference ADA
 - ALAMEDA COUNTY EMERGENCY SHELTER STANDARDS FOR YEAR-ROUND SHELTERS (2022 version)
 - Additional City standards also exist which might be found in city-funded shelter contracts



- We are unlikely to need a new set of shelter standards but perhaps the committee can focus on developing consistency of implementation, having enough resources, tracking gaps, ensuring clear complaint procedures with follow-up, and maintaining awareness of gaps
- Operationally, how do we respond to needs?
- Overall, what are the gaps?
- How do we process (and fund) reasonable accommodations needs?
- Real life scenarios should be considered
 - May shelters use bunk beds. Understanding lower bunks are needed for older/disability situations, the use of bunk beds creates chances that someone would be turned away due to only top bunks available. Still a reliance on single beds is unrealistic and would greatly reduce bed availability overall.
 - Someone's accessibility issues may change from night to night, such as with an injury. Individual shelters need to have a process to adapt to those types of situations
 - There are wide differences in abilities for people with similar named conditions and it won't be a uniform answer of who would or would not be able to use a top bunk

Next steps on this topic

- Review Alameda County Emergency Shelter Standards April 2022
- Reconnect with original commenter with an update on status, direct them to appropriate grievance process for that particular facility
 - Laurie Flores to help compose a response
 - Note that the CoC does not specific oversight on certain parts of this issue
- Explore this topic with the Standards, Funding, and Compliance Committee
