<p><b>4 Ice Breaker</b> (Homebase)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <i>“Before we dive into today’s discussions on system data, let’s do a quick warm-up. Think about a time in your own work or daily life when you had to <b>use data to make a decision</b>—big or small. It could be anything from reviewing program performance, adjusting a budget, or even tracking your personal fitness or spending. What was the data, and how did it help guide your decision?”</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The <b>facilitator calls on a few people to share</b> (or asks for volunteers).</li> <li>○ Each person gives a <b>short</b> response (e.g., <i>“I track how many no-shows we get at outreach events so we can adjust the timing and location to reach more people.”</i> or <i>“I used data on rental prices to decide when to move to a new apartment.”</i>).</li> <li>○ The <b>facilitator connects the exercise to the meeting</b>, emphasizing that <b>the same way we use data in daily decisions, we need to be thoughtful about how we interpret and apply data</b> to improve outcomes.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<b>2:10 – 2:15</b>
