## Committee Purpose

The purpose of the System Impact Committee is to monitor progress against the community's [strategic plan \(Home Together\)](#), including regular review of system-level and provider performance to support more rapid identification of emerging trends and needed changes to policy and programming. The committee will also be responsible for monitoring actual system performance against assumptions used in the Home Together system modeling to support updates to the plan as needed.

## Meeting Purpose / Overview

Today's System Impact Committee meeting will focus on grounding our understanding of system performance by reviewing HUD's System Performance Measures (SPMs) alongside Alameda County's strategic goals in the Home Together Plan. As the committee responsible for monitoring system-wide outcomes, we will use this data to identify performance gaps and begin shaping recommendations for the NOFO Performance Measures Workgroup. These recommendations will support strategic

funding decisions and ensure the CoC is advancing equity, impact, and accountability across all parts of the homelessness response system.

**Presentation: CoC Data Overview with a Focus on System Performance Measures (SPM) (Homebase, 2:25 – 2:40)**

- The SIC’s role around system performance is to review system performance at regular intervals and monitor for any emerging trends, reporting issues and recommendations to the Leadership Board as appropriate. Homebase has developed materials to support the Committee’s understanding of HUD’s System Performance Measures (SPMs), which are saved in the Committee Google Drive folder [[Primary CoC Data Sources](#)].
- Homebase will step the Committee through foundational information on CoC data sources and provide data to show how the CoC is performing against the HUD SPMs. Since the SIC is also responsible for tracking the CoC’s performance against the goals in the Home Together Plan, Homebase will crosswalk the SPMs with the CoC Committees so the SIC can identify which committees to engage when performance issues arise.

**Discussion: Recommendations to Performance Measures Workgroup (Homebase, 2:40 – 3:40)**

- The SIC’s role includes sharing information on provider and system performance with the CoC Standards, Compliance, and Funding (SCF) Committee to help inform funding decisions. While NOFO-related work lives with the SCF Committee, that committee has convened the NOFO Performance Measures Workgroup to carry the performance measures work forward. With the foundational information on CoC data sources and the SPM data in mind, the SIC will review progress toward Home Together Plan targets and identify key system gaps. Based on that analysis, the SIC will develop recommendations for the NOFO Performance Measures Workgroup to help prioritize funding allocations—particularly as they relate to subpopulation demographics, system-level needs, and CoC-specific intervention strategies.
